We received a call from one of our patient's parents in late fall. Aiko was sick and presented with a bad cough. Our coordinator asked if she had a pulse oximeter and blood pressure monitor to check her vitals. We also requested to check for Covid. Dr. Videlefsky gave a list of important things to look for to check her progress. As those symptoms started to worsen, they decided it was time to go to the Emergency Room. On the way to the Emergency Room, Aiko had a seizure. They were able to get her to the ER and she was placed in ICU where she was diagnosed with RSV. Dr. Videlefsky continued to check in with the family throughout her stay as she got strong enough to go home. Aiko's parents, stated that even after Aiko was discharged from the hospital. Dr.Videlefsky and Janice continued to check on Aiko. That level of care was something was above and beyond.

What an amazing job Aiko's parents did advocating for her. Our patient's health can be very fragile, and something that could be an average illness for someone else could be life-threating to our patients. This phone call and ADMH's quick response saved Aiko's life. This is why we care so much about our mission. Having basic home health instruments like a blood pressure monitor, pulse oximeter, and thermometer help the team make more accurate recommendations.

We will continue to strive to not only empower our patients and families but to provide the best comprehensive care possible!
